They include small businessmen, farmers, oyster growers, fertilizer peddlers, real estaters, stockbrokers, bankers, land surveyers, optometrists, military; people from places like Boeing, ITT, Nordstroms, J.C. Penney, and, of course, educators. The idea is to get a broad geographical representation and a cross section of employment backgrounds. Diversity should make it more fun.
