
Women choosing to play a less challenging course will play the Overlook Golf Course at Big Lake where the green fees are \$8 for 9 holes.

Even nongolfers may appreciate new MV club

MOUNT VERNON — Mike O'Laughlin said a few people have told him his golf course is so gorgeous, he might want to consider selling tours that include lunch. Anything is possible. However, nongolfers could be missing a great opportunity. Some will be used for about two seasons until the permanent facility is built on a nearby hill.

Behind the jackets is one of Eaglemont's nicer secrets, its deli, O'Laughlin said. The snack bar is open seven days a week and serves soup, sandwiches and hot dogs. He said it's perfect for the business getaway lunch.

"The views from this facility are spectacular," he said. "Many people don't realize what we have here." O'Laughlin's job means he runs the shop, keeps the office running smoothly and makes sure people are pleased with the facilities and their game.

Unfortunately, he said, it sometimes gets so hectic in his line of work, he can only get in one or two games of golf a week. And, he said, a golf pro needs to be in good form at all times, not rusty.

O'Laughlin comes to Eaglemont from Seattle's Sand Point Country Club, where he worked as assistant golf pro for seven years. Eaglemont's assistant

hand for those who want a golf course within backyard walking distance.

O'Laughlin operates his pro shop in a temporary building. Official golf shirts, jackets and hats with the Eaglemont logo hanging on the wall are the first thing a visitor sees. The building


for a scenic ride through wetlands, rolling greens, towering Douglas fir and awesome views in every direction — all visible from a winding golf-cart trail. The course is designed over hillsides, ravines and incorporates ponds and streams. Sand traps are just part of the challenge.

Visitors can see for themselves April 8 when Eaglemont Golf Club stages an open house for the Skagit Valley Tulip Festival.

Eaglemont is green and ready, a fact course pro O'Laughlin is not shy to advertise.


"We're up and running, there's no doubt about it," he said. Following the open house, the course at 4127 Eaglemont Drive in




Local Rules

1. USGA rules shall govern all play except where local rules apply.
2. Lost balls within the golf course boundary; drop a ball within 2 club lengths of the point of entry, one stroke penalty.
3. Red stakes or paint are considered lateral water hazards.
4. Wetlands are played as lateral water hazards - you must drop out side of hazard, two club lengths, no closer to the hole.
5. Please be courteous and keep up with the group ahead of you.
