

REPORT FOR WPA PROJECT #1, August 25-6, 1985
SIMILK BEACH GOLF COURSE
ANACORTES

To the amazement of most, WPA Project #1 was completed on schedule. Nine project managers and two inspectors traversed the course. They looked under the grass, eventually discovered 18 greens containing 18 cups. A few of the project managers even took sidetrips off the course to search for balls and to investigate possible sites for portable and fixed human refuse collectors. Similk Beach Golf Course was given a good going over.

Low gross was won by Jack Bracy with an 85 despite the fact he hit the lake on #16 fairway, though playing #12 hole. Murray Taylor gets the record though, because he hit the lake playing both #12 and #16. Gordon Krupke had the only skip out of the water, thus the record. Jack Bracy recorded the first birdie of the tourney with a 3 at #7. Vera Taylor equaled the 3 at #7 with a 120 yard chip in to claim the record in that category. Emmett Oliver set a record by chipping one in at #16 for a bogey. Emmett also set the low net record by a huge margin with his 62. (His handicap has gone down since). Inconsistency record goes to Murray Taylor for an 8 stroke swing from a 12 on #16 to a 4 on #17. Dullness records go to Bob Warnecke and Gordon Krupke, both shooting identical scores on front and back. Most improvement record goes to Bill Bates for shooting the back side 7 strokes better than he shot the front. Jack Green had the record for consistent scores, never over a double bogey and never under par. Well people, count the number of times your name is mentioned, multiply by \$1 and you know your debt to WPA #2.

Speaking of debts, WPA is now in debt, temporarily we hope. At WPA #2 you will get an OFFICIAL WPA golf cap. We ordered enough to last a while (had to to get our own emblem). The coffers should turn back to black as we get new members and their \$20. Besides, how could we call this group WPA unless we went in the hole somewhere.

Enclosed are a couple of forms for you to seek a new member or two. As you recall, we thought 35 to 40 would be a reasonable membership. With 17 now, we need to more that double, thus the two forms for new members. It would be nice to have 30 or so play in Yakima and around 35 in Tumwater.
